Graduated Vehicle Endorsement Program - GVE

Valid for all Drive-Star Divisions

Purpose:

This document sets out the background and recommendations for the implementation of an internal Graduated Vehicle Endorsement Program.

Objectives:

- 1. Drivers and contractors should only operate vehicle groups for which they have been duly qualified by Drive Star either based on previous experience or through additional training.
- 2. Dispatch must assign drivers only to vehicle-groups included in the appropriate DS-GVE Levels. No driver shall be permitted to operate a vehicle that is not included in his/her respective DS-GVE-Level.
